1.00 GENERAL COMMENTS

Every corporation must have one or more incorporator(s). However, the person(s) designated as incorporator(s) in the articles of incorporation need not be those who actually start up the business. It is standard practice for law clerks or paralegals who prepare the documents to designate themselves as incorporators in the articles.

The main advantage of incorporating businesses in this manner is that it is generally much more practical because the client does not have to sign them. Using this procedure, corporations may also be incorporated in anticipation of requests from clients, providing a corporation ready to be used at a client's request. A third advantage is the possibility of the client remaining anonymous if he prefers to use the name of an incorporator to avoid disclosing the name(s) of the person(s) working in the corporation.
